# ARTICLE 15 PROPOSED BAN ON NIP SALES IN PLYMOUTH

#### 14,000

In only 4 days of cleanups in Plymouth, volunteers picked up **over 14,000 LITTERED nips.** This is despite the fact that town wide cleanups have been occurring twice a year for over a decade.

#### 32%

In Falmouth, 32% of all collected litter items in cleanups were nips, making them the single largest item in the litter stream.

#### **ZERO**

Chelsea's nip ban has been in place for 5 years now and Robert Mellian, Executive Director of the Massachusetts Package Stores Association, acknowledged that "no liquor stores closed" in Chelsea after their ban went into effect.

#### 6%

After Falmouth's ban went into effect, only 6% of litter items were nips.

Should we wait for state legislation on recycling deposits?



#### NO!

Massachusetts has **refused** to increase deposits on beverages of any kind for **over 30 years**.

The State will not act with deliberate speed because special interest money has opposed packaging measures.

Even with a deposit, **these bottles cannot be recycled**. They are too small for the sorting machines to handle.

## What will the ban include?



#### ONLY 50ml & 100ml containers would be banned.

Alcohol will still be available in legal container sizes of 200ml and larger.
